What's in a name?

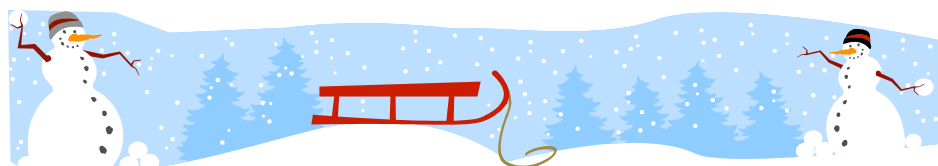

There are no other changes planned, and the fees to make this change with the State of Oregon are a mere \$55. The FOBL Board hopes you will join them in voting **yes** that night.

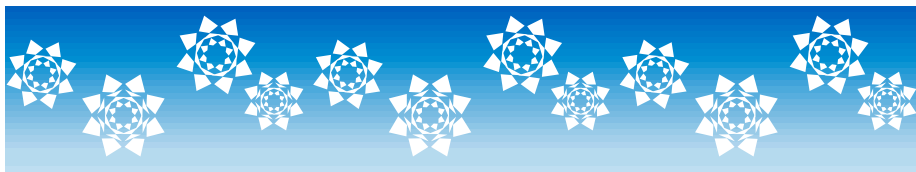
